CHAPTER 1: INTRODUCTION AND METHODOLOGY

1.1 This document is the Sustainability Appraisal Report following the Scoping Report for the Durham City Neighbourhood Plan (DCNP), and also covers the legal obligations of the Strategic Environmental Assessment Directive (2001/42/EC). As such, it aims to fulfil the requirements of the Environmental Appraisal of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004¹. The Report has been prepared by the members of the Durham City Neighbourhood Planning Forum, which is the 'qualifying body' for the purposes of these regulations. The methodology adopted is based on the guidance provided by the specialist consultants Levett-Therivel (Therivel et al, 2011) for those preparing Neighbourhood Plans; on the Practical Guide to the Strategic Environmental Assessment Directive (Office of the Deputy Prime Minister, 2005); and on the EU Directive itself (European Union, 2001).

What is SA/SEA and what does it mean for the DCNP?

- 1.2 In brief, Sustainability Appraisal (SA) is a process for assessing the social, economic and environmental impacts of a plan or programme and aims to ensure that sustainable development is at the heart of the plan-making process. Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) is also a systematic process to predict and assess potential impacts but focusses on specific environmental issues to ensure they are considered and integrated at the earliest opportunity. Given the similarities between the SA and SEA processes, they are often combined to avoid duplication. Such an approach is also widely recognised as best practice with regards to Local Plans and Neighbourhood Plans in England. When undertaking a 'joint' assessment it is often referred to as SA/SEA, but for the sake of brevity it will be referred to as SA in this report.
- 1.3 Unlike a Local Plan, there is no legal requirement for a Neighbourhood Plan to have a SA as set out in Section 19 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. However, a 'qualifying body' such as the Durham City Neighbourhood Plan Forum must demonstrate how its plan will contribute to achieving sustainable development. This is a 'basic condition' of the neighbourhood planning process (condition d). As such, undertaking a SA is a robust approach to demonstrably meet this condition.
- 1.4 Another basic condition the DCNP has to meet is to not 'breach, and is otherwise compatible with, EU obligations' (condition f). As explained in the Scoping Report, a Screening Report was prepared and, as required, considered by the three Statutory Consultees. Although ultimately only one statutory consultee Historic England considered that there was a need for an SEA/SA, given the significance of their concerns the decision was taken to conduct a Sustainability Appraisal of the Durham City Neighbourhood Plan to ensure that there was a demonstrable certainty that it would contribute towards sustainable development and that its policies would provide the necessary environmental protection, particularly with regard to Durham City's unique historic environment.

1.5 The SEA/SA of the DCNP follows the prescribed five-stage process as set out below in Table 1 and advised by published Government guidance².


The Durham City Neighbourhood Plan (DCNP)

- 1.6 The area covered by the Durham City Neighbourhood Plan is shown in Map 1. The area is centred on the historic core of the City, designated as a World Heritage Site, and includes Durham Cathedral and Castle situated above the incised banks of the River Wear. The Plan area includes the wards of Neville's Cross, Elvet & Gilesgate and the part of Durham South that is on the city side of the River Wear. In this report we call this area *Our Neighbourhood*. The Scoping Report sets out the wider context, geography and purposes of the Neighbourhood Plan. One factor that can now be updated is that our Forum will be replaced by the Durham City Parish Council for which elections will be held in April 2018.
- 1.7 The formally constituted Neighbourhood Planning Forum comprises 34 members with duly elected officers and a Working Group of between 10 and 12 volunteers have contributed to the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan. The Forum has met several times a year to receive and approve reports from the Working Group and organise and participate in consultation exercises with the public. The Working Group meets monthly and sometimes weekly. All of the notes of meetings are available to view on the Forum's website (http://npf.durhamcity.org.uk/) and public comments are welcomed and responded to. The Working Group has received guidance from officers of the County Council and has taken advantage of the advice of others preparing Neighbourhood Plans in the region.

Sustainability Appraisal Report structure

1.8 The first chapter provides information on the work that has preceded this Sustainability Appraisal Report. Chapter 2 sets out the identification of options; Chapter 3 gives a detailed account of the assessment of options; Chapter 4 describes the fine-tuning of the Plan so as to mitigate and minimise its potential adverse impacts; and Chapter 5 explains next steps. Appendix A contains all the detailed assessment tables.

CHAPTER 2: OPTIONS

- 2.1 In the particular circumstances pertaining over the preparation period and in particular the absence of the policy framework that would have been provided by a Local Plan for the County, existing planning policies and the issues arising from consultations, collected evidence, future pressures and needs were used to draw up initial draft policies before carrying out a Sustainability Assessment. Discussion within the Forum Working Group and with the County Council planning staff led in many cases to a considerable number of changes of wording, criteria, locations, and so on. This process involved consideration of options in some but not all policy topics. The Sustainability Appraisal that has now been carried out has provided the opportunity to document the options that have been tackled and the improvements to draft policies that resulted.
- 2.2 The constrained and historic form of most of Our Neighbourhood means that there are very few realistic options concerning choices of development sites, and the recent pace of construction of purpose-built student accommodation developments has eliminated most of the potential choices over alternative locations for major new developments. The options that have been identified are mainly whether or not the Neighbourhood Plan can offer a local policy that is a helpful refinement of existing planning policies. The options for Our Neighbourhood are considered under each theme as follows.

Theme 1: A City with a sustainable future

2.3 It would not be reasonable to develop policies that do not give full weight to sustainability as the bedrock of the National Planning Policy Framework, and therefore no other options have been evaluated.

Theme 2: A Beautiful and Historic City – Heritage

2.4 A number of approaches have been discussed. Clearly there are powerful national protections for the World Heritage Site and for Conservation Areas. There are also important additional policies in the Saved Policies of the City of Durham Local Plan. The key issue came down to the extent to which protecting and enhancing these assets beyond the level required by statute and existing planning policies would be effective. Clearly an option that harmed them would be unacceptable. It was concluded that the Neighbourhood Plan has only two options: either (a) rely upon the existing protections afforded to the World Heritage Site, Conservation Areas, character areas, and Listed Buildings under European and national statutes and the Saved Policies of the City of Durham Local Plan, or (b) develop more detailed and prescriptive policies that provide more stringent requirements and safeguards.

Theme 2: A Beautiful and Historic City – Green Infrastructure

- 2.5 There are many protections already in place to safeguard the qualities of the green infrastructure, so the issue to be considered was to what extent, if any, should further policies be added to protect and enhance:
 - the Wear Valley setting of the World Heritage Site;
 - the green spaces that contribute to Our Neighbourhood's character;
 - the green spaces that provide leisure opportunities;
 - · the green spaces that provide wildlife habitats; and

- the green spaces that help to combat climate change?
 As with built Heritage, the conclusion was that Our Neighbourhood has only two options: either (a) rely upon the existing protections afforded under European and national statutes and the Saved Policies of the City of Durham Local Plan, or (b) develop more detailed requirements and safeguards.
- 2.6 A further consideration under this heading is whether to promote the development of green infrastructure networks to link existing green spaces. The choice is between (a) leaving the situation as it is (i.e. do nothing) or (b) to develop a policy or policies that identify what should be done and where to form a defined set of links that comprise a network.
- 2.7 There are also questions to be asked about the Green Belt that provides the "green bowl" setting for the World Heritage Site. These will be addressed in the forthcoming County Plan. One option for the County Plan as suggested in the Issues and Options Report of June 2016 is to seek to reduce the Green Belt and permit extensive housing and office development in parts of that area. The options to be tested were therefore limited to:
- (a) try to protect the part of the Green Belt within Our Neighbourhood from such developments, or
- (b) allow some degree of development in certain circumstances, or
- (c) 'do nothing' and leave it to the County Local Plan to decide this issue. In considering these options it was important to examine whether some uses for the Green Belt could be found that would be beneficial to the community whilst being compatible with its fundamental purposes.

Theme 3: A City with a diverse and resilient economy

- 2.8 Durham City is an important location for employment for people who live here as well as for those who travel to work here. The key characteristic of the employment opportunities in Our Neighbourhood is that they are predominantly in the public sector. In developing draft policies consideration was given to (a) endorsing the present situation as acceptable given the nature of the regional economy is public sector dominated or (b) promoting more private sector employment.
- 2.9 The University of Durham, the County Council and the University Hospital of North Durham, are major contributors to the economy of Our Neighbourhood and well beyond. Space is at a premium in Durham City and so accommodating the growth of these major sources of employment is a key issue. Neither the County Council nor the Hospital has plans for major physical expansion, but the University of Durham does. The option is whether (a) to accommodate the University's plans for significant expansion or (b) to not accommodate them.
- 2.10 More detailed choices have been made in developing and refining the employment policies what classes of land use to identify on particular sites, whether boundaries should exclude or include Green Belt land, and what now should constitute the primary and secondary retail frontages in and around the city centre.

Theme 4: A City with attractive and affordable places to live

- 2.11 The allocation of specific areas of land for housing development is one of the most important roles of neighbourhood plans. The initial trawl for sites for residential development produced 21 possible sites as options. Field inspections showed that 5 had obvious inaccessibility, topographic or sensitivity problems. Environment Agency, County Council and independent consultancy AECOM comments took out 6 of the remaining 17 sites and reduced the size or capacity of 3 others. The details of how each option was retained, modified or eliminated are given in Appendix A.
- 2.12The population profile shows that just over half of those living here are students. That proportion is set to increase significantly as the University expands and brings students from its Stockton campus. This gives rise to a number of key issues with options to tackle them:
 - Given the very limited availability of development sites, the options are to (a) allocate every possible site to be only for non-student residential development, or (b) concede the two sites that the University has earmarked for its own development (Bede/Hild Colleges and Hollow Drift in Green Lane)
 - The County Council's interim student accommodation policy coupled with the Article 4 Direction is very welcome; the options are (a) simply confirming this policy as a statutory development policy in the Neighbourhood Plan or (b) learn from the implementation experience over the past 11 months and fine-tune it accordingly.
- 2.13 Our Neighbourhood has a retired and elderly population that is higher than the County average; this will also put pressure on medical services as well as social care provision. It is considered that there is no reasonable option other than to address these needs and also the need for suitable housing for the elderly.

Theme 5: A City with a modern and sustainable transport infrastructure

- 2.14 The County Council consultant's Sustainable Transport Strategy for Durham City (Durham County Council, 2016d referenced in the Scoping Report) emphasises the hierarchy that prioritises first walking, then cycling, then public transport and services, and then private vehicles. It is not reasonable to go against this strategy but the options relate to how we should support it:
 - (1) pedestrian traffic:(a) seek adequate provision to accommodate comfortably all of the pedestrian volumes now and anticipated, or (b) oppose developments that do not and cannot be accompanied by adequate provision at the site and elsewhere on the network;
 - (2) cycling: not a reasonable alternative to pursuing the principle of safer and attractive cycling choices wherever possible. In relation to provision for residential cycle parking the options are (a) to endorse the absence from the County Durham Parking and Accessibility Standards for residential cycle parking, or (b) to propose specific standards for residential cycle parking;
 - (3) road traffic congestion: measures to ease congestion in the city centre are primarily the responsibility of the County Council as Highways Authority. The options are (a) to not be concerned with the fact that some large employers provide extensive free car parking, or (b) propose measures to discourage people from bringing cars into the city, for example, by restricting on-street parking, and/or (c) make on-street parking more

flexible to help customers and clients, including disabled people, to access shops and businesses

(4) public transport: there are limited powers in the area of public transport which relate to land use policies. The only relevant option is to ensure that new developments are sited so that they are accessible by public transport.

Theme 6: A City with an enriched community life

2.15 There are no options being put forward on the development of community facilities and services to meet the needs of the whole population. This is a realistic aspiration, because there are no options other than to make the best possible efforts to meet the objectives within the scope of land use policies.

CHAPTER 3: ASSESSMENT OF OPTIONS

3.1 The following probing questions have been developed to help assess and test which options for emerging Plan policies best satisfy the adopted sustainability objectives set out in the Scoping Report.



3.2 The probing questions for each sustainability objective have been applied to each draft policy in turn, theme by theme, and the impact scored as being very positive (++); positive (+); neutral (0); negative (-); or very negative (--). The resulting tables setting out these assessments of 32 draft policies against 21 probing questions are extensive and are in Appendix A. Table 2 below summarises the assessment tables.

Table 2: Summary of the assessment tables



3.3 Table 2 shows that the options chosen for the draft policies have a positive and in some cases very positive impact in supporting the Sustainability Objectives. Not surprisingly, the policies that address objectives within their scope have the main positive impacts. None of the draft policies are considered to have a negative impact.

3.4 The explanation of why a particular option was chosen for the corresponding draft policy is set out theme by theme below.

Theme 1: A City with a sustainable future

Policy S1: Sustainable Development Requirements of all Development and Redevelopment Sites

Policy S2: Sustainable Development Requirements of all New Building Developments including Renovations and Extensions

3.5 The importance of sustainability in all developments is fully recognised, so it has been considered that the only option is that sites and buildings seeking planning permission must take measures to promote sustainability. It is also considered that, in order to reduce the risk of climate change, developers should be required to minimise greenhouse gas emissions though waste management, to use recycled and renewable materials, and to improve energy efficiency. Policies S1 and S2 are written accordingly.

3.6 As would be expected from policies that seek to ensure a sustainable approach to future site and building development, S1 and S2 emerge from the sustainability assessment as being demonstrably positive in their impact on relevant sustainability objectives. The main difference is that S1 is very strongly positive or positive in relation to all 15 objectives whereas S2 is similarly positive for 7 objectives with the remaining 9 not relevant. Furthermore, neither policy has a negative impact and, in fully complementing each other, they will help to achieve a more sustainable future.

Theme 2A A beautiful and historic City - Heritage

Policy H1: Protection of the World Heritage Site

3.7 In placing the protection of the World Heritage Site and its setting at the heart of this plan, it is intended that all policies should work together not only to protect and enhance the World Heritage Site but also to make the most of its economic and social value to Durham. The straightforward issue on this is whether to rely upon the existing protection and enhancement afforded to the World Heritage Site, Conservation Areas, Character Areas and Listed Buildings under European and national statutes (option 1a), or develop more detailed and prescriptive policies that provide more stringent requirements and safeguards (Option 1b). The sustainability analysis confirms that the latter option as taken forward in Policy H1 does add value in highlighting the sensitivity to necessary development and the opportunities for an increased contribution to the local economy from its attraction for development and tourism.

Policy H2: The Conservation Areas

3.8 The same options have been appraised and the analysis demonstrates the benefit of option 1b, which is adopted in Policy H2, over existing policies in other statutory plans and frameworks in adding value to the protection and enhancement of the Our Neighbourhood's two Conservation Areas. In more than a half of the sustainability objectives Option 1b provides enhanced recognition of the importance of the relationship between a strong

economy, tourism and coordinated development, and the protection and enhancement of the Conservation Areas.

Policy H3: The Character Areas

3.9 Option 1a relies upon existing policy and area definitions which give less recognition to the importance of maintaining the diversity of the environments of Our Neighbourhood than Option 1b. Character areas contain important buildings and groups of buildings of local importance and of particular vernacular style in each part of Our Neighbourhood and add to its economic potential. Policy H3 adopts Option 1b.

Policy H4: Our Neighbourhood outside the Conservation Areas

3.10 Option 1a by definition makes no impact, positive or negative, on areas outside the two Conservation Areas. Conversely, Option 1b specifically provides for sympathetic high quality designs appropriate to the character of the particular area and achieves positive to very positive impacts. Policy H4 adopts option 1b.

Policy H5: Listed Buildings, Scheduled Ancient Monuments, Registered Parks and Gardens and Registered Battlefields.

3.11 The existing statutory protections of Option 1a for Durham's important heritage buildings and sites are strong but Option 1b offers specific additional protections, standards and safeguards and the opportunity to realise their potential in making Durham more attractive to live in, to invest in and to visit. These positive impacts make Option 1b preferable to Option 1a. Policy H5 adopts option 1b.

Policy H6: Non-designated Heritage Assets

3.12 Option 1b would have a definite positive impact as against the 'do nothing' option 1a. Protecting non-designated heritage assets in Our Neighbourhood through Option 1b produces worthwhile benefits for the built environment and for residents and visitors. Policy H6 adopts option 1b.

Theme 2B A beautiful and historic City - Green Infrastructure

Policy G1: Preserving and Enhancing Green Infrastructure

3.13 Option 1b scores much more positively than reliance on existing protections and also provides more protection and greater enhancement of green assets. It also gives guidance for new developments on how to manage green assets, and will have more weight as saved policies are becoming out of date. Option 2a is less satisfactory than Option 2b because the lack of green infrastructure links can lead to the isolation and degradation of habitats.

Policy G2: Designation of Local Green Spaces

3.14 Option 1b is more positive than Option 1a: it adds a local layer of protection to already protected sites, and will have more weight as saved policies are becoming out of date.

Policy G3: Creation of the Emerald Network

3.15 Option 1b has a small positive advantage over Option 1a: it adds a local layer of protection and detail to already protected sites, provides a tourism, leisure and heritage asset, and will have more weight as saved policies are becoming out of date.

Policy G4: Enhancing the Beneficial Use of the Green Belt

3.16 Promoting existing Green Belt policy in Our Neighbourhood (Option 3a) scores far more positively than seeking to relax policy for small scale developments (Option 3b) or avoiding any policy influence by awaiting the adoption of the County Local Plan (Option 3c). Creating an opportunity for development in the Green Belt as in Option 3b in advance of a full strategic reconsideration of Green Belt function, form and reach would be is unwise and possibly damaging and this is reflected in the assessment. However, to avoid the Green Belt in policy terms as in Option 3c would weaken the scope and ambition of the plan and this is reflected in the assessment.

Theme 3: A City with a diverse and resilient economy

3.17 The following conclusions result from detailed appraisal of the two options that are relevant to this theme. Option 1a is based on the existing statutory plans and frameworks and the County Council's now withdrawn proposals at Aykley Heads, whereas Option 1b retains the existing Green Belt boundary adjacent to the Aykley Heads strategic employment site and limits the land uses on that site to those that will ensure the provision of high quality employment.

Policy E1: Larger Employment Sites

3.18 Option 1b shows the positive impact this policy will have on the economy of Our Neighbourhood when compared to Option 1a. In terms of the assessment, the policy will be positive in its impact on 7 of the 15 sustainability objectives with no impact on 8.

Policy E2: Other Employment Sites

3.19 Option 1b shows the positive impact that this policy will have on the economy and residential amenity of Our Neighbourhood when compared to 1a which updates the availability of such sites. In terms of the assessment, the policy will be positive in its impact on 9 of the 15 sustainability objectives.

Policy E3: Retail Development

3.20 Option 1b compared to Option 1a shows the positive impact this policy will have on the economy and vitality of Our Neighbourhood, which will in turn attract inward investment to aid regeneration of the City centre. In terms of the assessment, the policy will be positive in its impact on 11 of the 15 sustainability objectives with the other 4 demonstrating no effect.

Policy E4: Primary and Secondary Frontages

3.21 Option 1b compared to Option 1a shows in general that this policy will have a positive impact on the retail economy in the City centre. In terms of the assessment, the policy will be positive in its impact on 6 of the 15 sustainability objectives with the other 9 demonstrating no effect.

Theme 4: A City with attractive and affordable places to live

Policy D1: Land for Residential Development

3.22The appraisal has confirmed that there are seven sites suitable for allocation for residential development in Policy D1 with a further four as potential allocations. Site D1.4 is a particularly prominent and sensitive site in the landscape bowl setting of the World Heritage Site in relation to Sustainability Objective 9, and all sites in relation to Sustainability Objective 10. The option 1a of retaining the two potential sites that the University has earmarked for its own development is more positive for Objectives 4 and 5 than conceding both sites but other factors, notably the firm intentions of the University of Durham to develop both sites for its own purposes, determine this issue in of favour of Option 1b which is Policy D1. Adjustments in relation to flooding concerns and to design and landscaping matters have modified the boundaries of some sites and reduced the capacities of others.

Policy D2: Student Accommodation in Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMOs)

3.23 The interim policy for Houses in Multiple Occupation has a very strong positive impact, and will be even more beneficial with the tighter criteria proposed in Policy D2. There is a major impact from the scale of expansion of the University of Durham; too great a rate of growth coupled with an increase in the number of HMOs will potentially have a negative impact on several Objectives. This can be mitigated within the Plan by the tighter criteria being proposed.

Policy D3: Purpose Built Student Accommodation (PBSA)

3.24 The interim policy for Purpose Built Student Accommodation has a very strong positive impact, and will be even more beneficial with the adjustments proposed. There is a major impact from the scale of expansion of the University of Durham; too great a rate of growth coupled with PBSAs in the wrong locations will potentially have a negative impact on several Objectives. This can be mitigated within the Plan by the tighter criteria being proposed. Outside of the Plan's remit there is a potentially negative impact arising from University growth exceeding the capacity of College accommodation (including affiliated PBSAs) and from students preferring HMOs to PBSAs.

Policy D4: Housing for Older People and People with Disabilities

3.25 The policy has a positive or very positive impact on several Objectives. No options to be considered.

Policy D5: Meeting Other Housing Needs

3.26 The policy has a positive or very positive impact on several Objectives. No options to be considered.

Policy D6: Design of New and Renovated Housing to the Highest Standards

3.27 The policy has a positive impact on several Objectives. No options to be considered.

Theme 5: A City with a modern and sustainable transport infrastructure

Policy T1 Accessibility of Proposed Developments

3.28 Policy T1 (Options 1b, 2 and 3b/3c and 4) scores more positively than Option1a/3a: it provides the protection of 1a but also provides for more access to green infrastructure and improves the tourism offer.

Policy T2: Designing for Sustainable Development

3.29 Policy T2 (including Options 1b, 2 and 3) is more comprehensive in addressing sustainable transport design. It responds to the County Council's consultant's Sustainable Transport Strategy which recommends adopting the highest possible design standards for developments.

Policy T3: Residential Car Parking in the Controlled Parking Zone

3.30T3 which includes Option b scores more positively than the existing County Durham Parking and Accessibility Standard because it allows for lower levels of car parking in residential areas provided that certain circumstances are met. The Durham County-wide car parking standards do not take into account the specific social, economic and environmental aspects of Our Neighbourhood whereas Policy T3 can be shown to be more sustainable.

Policy T4: Residential Cycle Parking

3.31 T4 (including 4(b) scores far more positively than (a). However, the impact of this policy on the positive benefits of healthier lifestyles, less air pollution and road congestion will depend on increased uptake of cycling and on reduced car dependency for those who use mobility aids. These are very much a minority form of transport at present.

Theme 6: A City with an enriched community life

Policy C1: Community Arts Facilities

3.32 The analysis shows that Policy C1 does not have a single negative impact, seven of the sustainability objectives show an overall positive impact and three are very positive.

Policy C2: Information Hub

3.33 Policy C2 is shown to not a single negative impact, six of the sustainability objectives have an overall positive impact and three are very positive.

Policy C3: Provision of New Community Facilities

3.34 There is not a single negative impact from Policy C3, two of the sustainability objectives have an overall positive impact and three are very positive.

Policy C4: Protection of an Existing Community Facility

3.35 Only two of the fifteen sustainability objectives are addressed by Policy C4, and both of these have a positive impact.. This policy is designed to protect existing facilities, and while one might anticipate positive benefits arising from protecting them, this would be too speculative so we have taken a cautious approach while hoping for better consequences.

Policy C5: Protection of Urban Open Spaces

3.36 Policy C5 shows not a single negative impact; five of the sustainability objectives have an overall positive impact and one, to protect and enhance the biodiversity, geodiversity and green infrastructure within Our Neighbourhood, scores very positive..

Policy C6: Health Care and Social Care Facilities

3.37 The analysis of Policy C6. Shows that there is not a single negative impact, five of the sustainability objectives have an overall positive impact and two are very positive.

CHAPTER 4: FINE-TUNING THE PLAN

4.1 As a consequence of undertaking the Strategic Environmental Assessment as a response to Historic England's comments on an early draft of the Plan, most of the consideration of options and of improvements to wordings, criteria, safeguards and so on has already been undertaken. It is important to capture the changes that have been made as drafting of policies progressed, particularly those which addressed the evident negative impacts. Table 3 presents the key cases of adjusting and fine-tuning of draft policies and proposals so as to maximise positive impacts and remove or mitigate negative impacts.

CHAPTER 5: NEXT STEPS

- 5.1 The Draft Durham City Neighbourhood Plan, together with its associated Screening, Scoping and Sustainability Appraisal Reports, will be the subject of a 6 week public and statutory body consultation from 4 November to 18 December 2017. See the panel at the end for details of where to inspect all the documents and how to comment. The Forum will analyse all responses, make appropriate improvements to the Plan and formally submit it to the County Council.
- 5.2 The County Council will then carry out a consultation on whether the submitted Plan meets the 'Basic Conditions', arrange for an agreed independent inspector to examine the Plan, make recommended modifications to the Plan that it chooses to make, and for a referendum to be held. If more than 50% of those voting in the referendum vote 'yes', then the local planning authority is required to bring the Plan into force.
- 5.3 It is important to note that neighbourhood forums exist to produce neighbourhood plans and have a designation of five years only. They do not have a formal role in the implementation of a neighbourhood plan. The members of a neighbourhood forum may want to consider how they can stay involved and support implementation, perhaps through the creation of another type of formal group.
- 5.4 In the case of the Durham City Neighbourhood Planning Forum, because it was formally created in January 2014 it will cease to exist in January 2019. However, it may cease sooner than that a Durham City Parish Council will be elected in May 2018, and might as it is entitled to do take over the completion of the Neighbourhood Plan, or it might invite a similar group of volunteers to finishing the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan.
- 5.5 Whenever the plan is finally 'made' (that is, becomes the formal statutory plan for the area) it is essential that its significant impacts are monitored. Chapter 5 of the Consultation Draft Neighbourhood Plan November 2017 sets out the Forum's approach to implementation and monitoring. It explains that it is necessary to monitor the Plan on a regular basis and important that the maximum assistance is available from bodies that hold information, particularly Durham County Council. The recommendation in the Draft Plan is that a monitoring report is produced on an annual basis by the City of Durham Parish Council (or the body that it may promote to do this work on its behalf). This report could be informed by an annual qualitative questionnaire survey of residents. Monitoring by the County Council of the Durham City Masterplan will also provide extremely useful information.
- 5.6 It will be the role of the City of Durham Parish Council (or sponsored body) to establish appropriate policy indicators and targets. The Forum suggests possible ones below in Table 4. It should be noted that some of the indicators/targets are, by the nature of the policy in question, qualitative.

The heading that is most relevant to this sustainability theme concerns climate change which has to be an overriding consideration in all plans. Although the County Council has the primary responsibility for combatting climate change, we recognise the importance of sustainability in all developments. So we have considered **as our only option** that sites and buildings seeking planning permission must take measures to promote sustainability. We have also considered that in order to reduce the risk of climate change developers should be required to minimise greenhouse gas emissions though waste management, to use recycled and renewable materials, and to improve energy efficiency. Policies S1 and S2 are written accordingly and assessed against the sustainability objectives and probing questions below.

There is a striking difference between the two policies. S1 dealing with development sites, makes a positive impact on every objective. Option 1b would have a definite positive impact as against the 'do nothing' option 1a. Protecting non-designated heritage assets in Our Neighbourhood through option 1b produces worthwhile benefits for the built environment and for residents and visitors. Policy H6 adopts option 1b.

Policy G4: Enhancing the Beneficial Use of the Green Belt

The options listed in Chapter 4 of the Scoping Report that are relevant to this Policy are:

- 3. Developments in the Green Belt. We have the options of:
 - (3a) to try to protect the part of the Green Belt within Our Neighbourhood from developments, except for enhancements as allowed by the NPPF. **Policy G4 took this option**;
 - (3b) to allow some degree of development in certain circumstances e.g. as allowed by the NPPF;
 - (3c) do nothing and leave it to the County Local Plan to decide this issue. One option for the County Plan as suggested in the Issues and Options Report of June 2016 is to seek to reduce the Green Belt and permit extensive housing and office development in parts of that area.

So the options for sustainability assessment are G4 (which includes 3a) versus 3b and 3c. These options are assessed against the sustainability objectives and probing questions below.

Promoting existing Green Belt policy in Our Neighbourhood (Option 3a) scores far more positively than seeking to relax policy for small scale developments (Option 3b) or avoiding any policy influence by awaiting the adoption of the County Local Plan (Option 3c). Creating an opportunity for development in the Green Belt as in Option 3b in advance of a full strategic reconsideration of Green Belt function, form and reach would be is unwise and possibly damaging and this is reflected in the assessment. However, to avoid the Green Belt in policy terms as in Option 3c would weaken the scope and ambition of the plan and this is reflected in the assessment.

- 1. To what extent do the options set out a clear economic vision and strategy, which positively and proactively encourages sustainable economic growth? The choice is:
 - a) Endorse the present situation.
 - b) Promote more employment in Our Neighbourhood including public, private and voluntary sector jobs. This option would involve making provision for more modern office spaces, supporting the County Council's scheme for a business park at Aykley Heads, the development of high-tech small and medium-sized enterprises and business incubators in order to encourage a better balance between the three sectors. In the retail sector encouragement of specialist independent retailers would also be particularly beneficial in attracting tourism. Supporting and enhancing electronic communication infrastructure, which will be important in ensuring that Durham improves its commercial competitiveness whilst avoiding impact on the World Heritage Site and the Green Belt.

Policies E1, E2, E3 and E4 took option b

Note that Durham University is a major employer in Our Neighbourhood, as acknowledged in Chapter 4 paragraph 4.15 of the Scoping Report. However, apart from recognising that more is needed to encourage graduates to remain in the area and an aspiration to be less dependent on the larger established employers in Our Neighbourhood, it has not yet been possible to take into account the University's plans for expansion and the impact on the economy of these policies.

Option 1b compared to Option 1a shows in general that this policy will have a positive impact on the retail economy in the City centre. In terms of the assessment, the policy will be positive in its impact on 6 of the 15 sustainability objectives with the other 9 demonstrating no effect.

THEME 4: A CITY WITH ATTRACTIVE AND AFFORDABLE PLACES TO LIVE

Alignment of policies with objectives:

There is a clear match between the policies and the objectives of this theme:

Policies:

Objectives:

- 1. To change the imbalance towards student accommodation back to a sustainable, balanced community;
- 2. To provide housing designed for the needs of older people and for people with disabilities;
- 3. To provide affordable housing for all sectors of the community, but particularly for families with children and young people starting out.

Consideration of options:

The options listed in Chapter 4 of the Scoping Report that are relevant to Policy D1 are:

- 1. Given the very limited availability of development sites, we could:
 - (1a) allocate every possible site to be only for non-student residential development, or
 - (1b) concede the two sites that the University has earmarked for its own development Bede/Hild Colleges and Hollow Drift in Green Lane. **Policy D1 took option 1b.**

These options are assessed against the sustainability objectives and probing questions below.

Policy D1: Land for Residential Development

The initial trawl for sites for residential development produced 21 possible sites for consideration. However, field inspections showed that 5 had obvious inaccessibility, topographic or sensitivity problems. Environment Agency, County Council and independent consultancy AECOM comments took out 6 of the remaining 17 sites and reduced the size or capacity of 3 others. Seven of the eleven sites are firm allocations; the other four are aspirations to allocate if the ownership/potential flood risk issues can be overcome. The resulting re-numbering of sites is given in brackets.

- 1. (D1.1) Whinney Hill (former Johnston School): <u>allocate</u> at indicative 48 units (the SHLAA 2013/14 figure of 77 units is reduced to 48 because the County Council's environmental assessment team consider that the landscape quality and shape of this site merits a lower figure).
- 2. Land at 6th Form Centre, currently a car park: possibly 14 units but **dropped** because it likely to be retained by the Centre and also may be subject to flooding.
- 3. (D1.2) John Street: <u>allocate</u> 22 units as possible apartments from previous approval..
- 4. (D1.3) Former Bernard Gilpin Society, The Sands: <u>allocate</u> 10 units despite having approval for 35, to match existing estate.
- 5. (D1.8) Former Shell Garage, A167: <u>aspire to allocate</u> 4 units rather than SHLAA's 8, to match existing houses.
- 6. Bede College: possibly 58 units but **dropped** because it is to be redeveloped by the University of Durham who own the site.
- 7. Hollow Drift, Green Lane: possibly 35 units but **dropped** because it is to be redeveloped by the University of Durham who own the site.
- 8. (D1.4) Site of Government Offices, Framwellgate Peth: <u>allocate</u> 440 units as approved in mixed-use scheme including apartments. The proposed allocation originally used the boundary of the whole multi-use planning permission; the County Council's environmental assessment team note that the riverside part is subject to flooding. Accordingly, the boundary has been revised to contain only the residential area, which is at the top of the whole site and well away from any possible flooding.
- 9. (D1.9) Sidegate electricity sub-station: aspire to allocate 12 units.
- 10. Lovegreen car park: 4 units but **dropped** because the whole site is subject to flooding.

- 11. (D1.10) Council-owned car park: possibly 30 units but <u>aspire to allocate</u> 20 units instead because the County Council's environmental assessment team consider that this site merits a lower density than we envisaged.
- 12. (D1.5) Offices at Diamond Terrace: allocate 3 units.
- 13. (D1.6) Main Street USA: allocate 3 units (current planning permission for 5).
- 14. Field at bottom of Potters Bank on the right: possibly 5 units but **dropped** because the County Council's environmental assessment team note that this is too sensitive a site to be capable of acceptable residential development.
- 15. (D1.11) Small site next to Sainsbury supermarket on A167: aspire to allocate 2 units.
- 16. (D1.7) Number 24 a, b and c The Avenue: allocate 3 units.
- 17. Site behind Observatory Hill: possibly 20 units but **dropped** because the County Council's environmental assessment team note that this is too sensitive a site to be capable of acceptable residential development)
- 18, 19 and 20. The Downs: three suggested areas, rejected as all far too steep to develop.
- 21. Adj St Cuthbert's Cemetery: rejected as too steep and impossible to provide satisfactory access
- (22. Note: AECOM raised the possibility of a site at Elvet Waterside but the Forum responded that this site had encountered opposition from the Environment Agency on flood risk grounds and from widespread public concern. This suggested possible site has not been taken forward.)

Thus there are 7 proposed allocations and 4 aspire-to-allocate sites in Policy D1 to be assessed against the sustainability objectives and probing questions below.

The appraisal has confirmed that there are seven sites suitable for allocation for residential development in Policy D1 with a further four as potential allocations. The option 1a of retaining the two potential sites that the University has earmarked for its own development is more positive for Objectives 4 and 5 than conceding both sites but other factors, notably the firm intentions of the University of Durham to develop both sites for its own purposes, determine this issue in of favour of Option 1b which is Policy D1. Fine-tuning in relation to flooding concerns and to design and landscaping matters has modified the boundaries of some sites and reduced the capacities of others. Rigorous application of Policies S1 and S2 and Policies H1 to H6 will be required in relation to Sustainability Objectives 9 and 10.

Outside of the Plan's remit there is a potentially negative impact arising from University growth exceeding the capacity of College accommodation (including affiliated PBSAs) and from students preferring HMOs to PBSAs.

The options listed in Chapter 4 of the Scoping Report that are relevant to this Policy are:

- 1.To what extent should we support the County Council's Sustainable Transport Strategy for Durham City? The choice is:
 - (1a) in terms of pedestrian traffic, we could seek adequate provision to accommodate comfortably all the pedestrian volumes now and anticipated, or
 - (1b) oppose developments that do not and cannot be accompanied by adequate provision at the site and elsewhere on the network. **Policy T1 took this option.**
- 2 There is no alternative to pursuing the principle of safer and attractive cycling choices wherever possible.
- 3 Measures to ease road traffic congestion in the city centre are primarily the responsibility of the County Council. We have the options of:
 - (3a) to not concern ourselves with the fact that some large employers provide extensive free car parking, or
 - (3b) to propose measures to discourage people from bringing cars into the city, for example, by restricting on-street parking, and/or
 - (3c) at the same time make on-street parking more flexible to help people, including disabled people, to access shops and businesses. Policy T1 took the options (3b) and (3c).
- 4. There is no alternative to ensuring that new developments are sited so that they are accessible by public transport.

T3 which includes Option b scores more positively than the existing County Durham Parking and Accessibility Standard because it allows for lower levels of car parking in residential areas provided that certain circumstances are met. The Durham County-wide car parking standards do not take into account the specific social, economic and environmental aspects of Our Neighbourhood whereas Policy T3 can be shown to be more sustainable.

Policy T4: Residential Cycle Parking

Consideration of options

The options listed in Chapter 4 of the Scoping Report that are relevant to this Policy are:

- 4 (a) to endorse the absence from the County Durham Parking and Accessibility Standards for residential cycle parking, or
- 4 (b) to propose specific standards for residential cycle parking.

Policy T4 chose Option 4b. The initial assessment against the probing questions identified that the policy could usefully be extended to cover storage for mobility aids and children's buggies, and incorporate electric charging facilities. The following table reflects these modifications. (Scores and comments have been corrected).

Conclusions
T4 (including 4(b) scores far more positively than (a). However, the impact of this policy on the positive benefits of healthier lifestyles, less air pollution and road congestion will depend on increased uptake of cycling and on reduced car dependency for those who use mobility aids. These are very much a minority form of transport at present.
